

My responsibilities:

The canonical term for this position in the office of the bishop is *protosyncellus*. He assists in the bishop's ministry to the whole eparchy by serving as a consultant to him as necessary, officially representing him at functions which the bishop cannot attend, serving as his delegate in matters concerning the clergy and the faithful, and making decisions on a limited basis in the name of the bishop for the good governance of the eparchy in the absence of the bishop. The protosyncellus must always exercise this office with the "intention and mind" of the bishop (canon 249).

At your service:

- Working with you as an active member of the eparchial councils and commissions (see pages 14 and 15);
- Consulting with parishes on liturgical and pastoral matters;
- Granting dispensations and permissions for marriages in the name of the bishop;
- Offering pastoral guidance to clergy and faithful;
- Leading parish missions and retreats;
- Substituting for parish priests when they are away from their parishes;
- Acting as the bishop's delegate in matters concerning the eparchial Safer Environments protocol;
- Directing the eparchial ministries, particularly in the areas of Catechesis and Youth Ministry;
- Giving theological input where required;
- Praying for your intentions;
- Serving the Divine Liturgy and celebrating the Holy Mysteries.

Support the ministry of the eparchial bishop in all areas of responsibility as required.

Coordinate the eparchy-wide implementation of the Eparchy of Edmonton's Safer Environments Protocol, "Working Together for Safer Environments: Policies and Protocols Regarding Abuse and Protection of Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adults."

Supporting:

- All pastors and Parish Pastoral Councils in their responsibilities of Volunteer Management, including the proper screening of volunteers and the management of Police Information Checks and Vulnerable Sector Searches at the parish and eparchial level;
- ♦ Safer Environment Training for those required to take the training, including all clergy, parish and eparchial staff, volunteers in a leadership role and those working with the vulnerable sector:
- The regular and proper screening of all clergy, eparchial and parish staff and volunteers working with the vulnerable sector;
- ◆ The development and implementation of Safer Environments Policy updates in light of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' document, *Protecting Minors from Sexual Abuse: A Call to the Catholic Faithful in Canada for Healing, Reconciliation, and Transformation;*
- ◆ The appropriate and timely response to allegations of misconduct by any member of the clergy, staff or parish volunteers within the Eparchy of Edmonton.

Our responsibilities:

Helping young people encounter Christ and recognize the centrality of their faith and community in the wonderful yet turbulent process of growing up. Building relationships and formation of future church leaders.

The Director of Youth Ministry is responsible for mentorship and training of youth ministers for parish ministry. Working with parishes and schools to provide programs to model the love of Christ through caring relationships. Working with young adult ministry including World Youth Day, Inter-Eparchial Youth Unity Retreat, Pilgrimages. Mentor young people to be disciples. Oversee operations of the children's camp at Camp Oselia, working in mutual support with Fr. Bo Nahachewsky.

At your service:

- Develop leadership skills in youth and young adults;
- Facilitate and provide development opportunities for parish and school ministry;
- ◆ Coordinate recruitment, training, and mentorship/support, in the youth ◆ ministry program;

My responsibilities:

The Inter-Eparchial Marriage Tribunal's ministry is to accompany those who have experienced a divorce to come to full healing through the Declaration of Nullity process. We accompany the party or parties of the previous marriage throughout all stages of the judicial process (canon law), from listening to the hurts of their previous marriage all the way to the final judgment. We explain the benefits of such a process and hopefully help them to enter a future marriage in a better state than they did in their previous marriage.

At your service:

I am happy to assist our clergy, lay personnel and parishes in answering any one of the plethora of questions that come up in such a process: Why? How? When? How long? I can also assist Pastors in their first contact with the parties at the preliminary stages of information gathering. The following provides some areas in which I may serve you:

- Provide updated forms for the Declaration of Nullity Process;
- Answer any preliminary questions regarding how the process will unfold;
- Assist in answering any questions which either of the parties to the previous marriage may have;
- Handle Lack of Form cases or explore other canonical options regarding a previous marriage;
- Act as a resource for questions regarding the pre-nuptial inquiry for Marriage Papers.

Our responsibilities:

The Cemetery Ministry is responsible for the operation and care of the Eparchy's two Edmonton based cemeteries: St. Michael's and Rosehill Cemeteries. These cemeteries are available to the public and offer traditional burial, cremated remains options, Mausoleum entombment and more recently environmentally friendly interments. The cemeteries also carry products such as burial liners and vaults, cremation urns, monuments, and vases for the public to purchase for cemetery use. Both pre-arranged cemetery arrangements or at-need arrangements are offered.

At your service:

The Cemetery Ministry staff look after families requiring burial/cremation services or are simply requiring information on estate planning or funeral arrangements for themselves. Our staff are sensitive to the needs of the bereaved and are there for them in times of mourning. The Director of Cemeteries also serves as a resource to the Eparchial Districts regarding matters pertaining to their own rural cemeteries. The Director of Cemeteries is available to advise District Parishes on legislation pertaining to their own cemeteries or hold workshops with the Districts. Workshops address establishing "rules and regulations" or action plans regarding care of rural cemeteries.



Eparchial Councils and Commissions

PRESYBYTERAL COUNCIL

The Presbyteral Council of the Eparchy of Edmonton is a body of priests representing the presbyterate which assists the eparchial bishop by its advice in those things that regard the needs of pastoral activity and the good of the eparchy.

COLLEGE OF CONSULTORS

The College of Consultors is a body of priests, chosen from the Presbyteral Council, who act as official advisors to the eparchial bishop in certain matters determined by law pertaining to the administration of the eparchy, and as a governing board when the eparchial see is vacant or impeded.

EPARCHIAL FINANCE COUNCIL

The Eparchial Finance Council is an organ of collaboration of the Christian faithful with the eparchial bishop in the administration of the financial matters of the entire eparchy. The members of the council have only a consultative vote, unless expressly required by canon law in special cases or if the document creating the council requires their consent. Besides the functions given to it in canon law, the finance council is to prepare an annual budget of the revenues and expenditures foreseen in the coming year in the governance of the whole eparchy as well as examine the account of revenues and expenses at the end of the year.

COMMISSION FOR SACRED ORDERS AND MINISTRIES

The Commission for Sacred Orders and Ministries is a stable body of priests, religious and lay faithful who work as an advisory body to the bishop concerning seminary formation, admission of candidates and review of petitions for diaconal and priestly ordination.

UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC COUNCIL (CENTRALIA)

The Ukrainian Catholic Council (Centralia) - Eparchy of Edmonton unifies and coordinates the activities of the Ukrainian Catholic Women's League of Canada (UCWLC), the Ukrainian Catholic Brotherhood of Canada (UCBC), the Ukrainian Catholic Youth of Canada (UCYC) and the Knights of Columbus - Edmonton Chapter (EECKofC).

EPARCHIAL YOUTH COMMISSION

The Eparchial Youth Commission provides pastoral oversight for children, youth and young adults, involving and engaging young people in the life and mission of the Church.

EPARCHIAL PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Eparchial Pastoral Council engages the vital forces of the eparchy in the programming of the apostolate and in the mission of the Church. It is comprised of clergy, religious and especially laypeople. It has the task of studying problems of pastoral work and proposing practical solutions whereby the faithful may pattern their lives more completely on the gospel.

EPARCHIAL CATECHETICAL COMMISSION

The Eparchial Catechetical Commission assists in catechetical formation within the Eparchy of Edmonton. The Commission provides for religious education formation within families and parish communities, helping the faithful mature in their faith as disciples of Christ. It engages in articulating the vision and mission of the eparchy's catechetical ministry to children, youth and adults and provides direction and assistance to the Director of Religious Education.

EPARCHIAL LITURGICAL COMMISSION

The Eparchial Liturgical Commission assists in liturgical celebration and formation within the Eparchy of Edmonton. The Commission advises the bishop on liturgical matters; study and research liturgical issues; provide ritual and liturgical texts for use in the Eparchy; oversee the preparation of liturgical educational materials; regulate pastoral liturgical action; and maintain relations with the Patriarchal Liturgical Commission and the Synodal Liturgical Committee.

EPARCHIAL ECUMENICAL COMMISSION

The Eparchial Ecumenical Commission seeks to foster greater unity among all Christians through prayer, dialogue and common initiatives. It has a special regard for relations with the Orthodox community. In addition, it extends its concern to matters pertaining to inter-faith dialogue and co-operation, especially in the area of social justice. It engages in articulating the vision and mission of the eparchy's ecumenical ministry and provides direction and assistance to the Director of Ecumenism.

SAFER ENVIRONMENTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (REGARDING ABUSE AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN, YOUTH AND VULNERABLE ADULTS)

The Committee supports the implementation of the Eparchy of Edmonton's Safer Environments policy, "Working Together for Safer Environments: Policies and Protocols Regarding Abuse and Protection of Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adults." The Committee also investigates all complaints regarding abuse of children, youth and vulnerable adults assigned to it by the bishop or the bishop's delegate and makes recommendations within an appropriate timeframe to the bishop or appropriate persons regarding actions to be taken.
