

UPCOMING EVENTS

The people of Ukraine need your help. As we mark the one-year anniversary of the war in Ukraine, millions of the country's inhabitants are in dire straits. Constant bombardment, frigid temperatures, fluctuating power, lack of food, shelter and other basic necessities. As part of personal sacrifice, kindly consider making a donation towards providing emergency services and humanitarian and pastoral support to Ukrainians by offering care, medical supplies, food, clothing and shelter to displaced persons, the elderly and the sick, as well as educational programs and support to local priests. For example, for only \$25, an emergency food package can provide much needed relief. \$100 can buy four packages. Each package will feed 2 persons for 1 week.

The Standing Committee for Family and Life – Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops have prepared a Pastoral Toolkit to support parishes in promoting National Family and Life Week (NFLW) from May 7-14, 2023.

The theme chosen for this year's NFLW is Jesus' words, "Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another" (John 13:34).

Inspired by this theme, the Pastoral Toolkit developed for NFLW 2023 emphasizes the joy and beauty of family and life by highlighting various lived experiences of those in our local communities. The toolkit includes a message from the CCCB President, an official logo, daily prayer intentions and

activities for families and parishes, catechesis, a daily social media campaign based on related saints, and pastoral suggestions for a family and life Mass.

This year's theme is "Walking Together in Catholic Education: As for us, we will walk in the name of the Lord Our God forever and ever" (Mikah 4:5).

ANNOUNCEMENTS

New! The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) have issued the North American Final Document for the Continental Stage of the 2021-2024 Synod: For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.

Begun in October 2021, the "Synod on Synodality" was recently extended by Pope Francis through October 2024, to allow for more time for reflection and discernment from both the local and universal Church. The Universal Phase of the Synod will be held in two parts, the first in October 2023 and the second a year later in October 2024.

The North American Final Document for the Continental Stage is available in English.

Initially at the request of the Knights of Columbus – Alberta/NWT as part of their Faith Formation Program, Bishop David, who serves as State Chaplain, produced a monthly series of reflections on "We are People of the Eucharist: towards a renewed love for Holy Communion." The fifth reflection in the series focuses on <u>Jesus' new command</u>, "love one another." A new video reflection will be posted each month in the hopes that it may inspire us in our faith journey.
