New! The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) each year marks the **National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples** on **December 12**, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas (Roman Catholic liturgical calendar).

This year's Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples is taken from the Holy Father's Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada in July 2022, in particular, his words of prayer offered at Lac Ste. Anne:

"Lord, as the people on the shores of the Sea of Galilee were not afraid to cry out to you with their needs, so we come to you, Lord ... with whatever pain we bear within us. We bring to you our weariness and our struggles, the wounds of the violence suffered by Indigenous brothers and sisters. In this blessed place, where harmony and peace reign, we present to you the disharmony of our experiences, the terrible effects of colonization, the indelible pain of so many families, grandparents and children. Lord, help us to be healed of our wounds. We know, Lord, that this requires effort, care and concrete actions on our part; but we also know that we cannot do this alone. We rely on you and on the intercession of your mother and your grandmother. Yes, Lord, we entrust ourselves to the intercession of your mother and your grandmother, because mothers and grandmothers help to heal the wounds of our hearts." Pope Francis declared 2025 as a Jubilee Year designating its theme as "Pilgrims of Hope."

In the words of the Holy Father, "Pilgrims of Hope" evokes "the movement of a Church that walks in pilgrimage to the light of hope that makes the future possible.... The Jubilee, with its focus on conversion, forgiveness, abundance, walk, and mercy, becomes a possibility for the future itself.

"Hope is the light that brightens the future, but not in a naively optimistic sense. We know it: hope is Jesus Christ dead and risen.... "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light; on the inhabitants of a country in shadow dark as death light has blazed forth." (Isaiah 9:1). The light is that of the Son made Man, Jesus, who with the very Word, gathers every people and every nation.

"We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire; that is why I have chosen as the motto of the Jubilee, Pilgrims of Hope."

New! Pope Francis blessed the decision of the Synod of Bishops of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in appointing Rev. Michael Smolinksi, CSsR, as Bishop of the Eparchy of Saskatoon.

Bishop-Elect currently serves as the Provincial Superior of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, Province of Canada.

Born and raised in Saskatoon, Bishop-Elect Michael served in pastoral ministry in Saskatchewan, as well as in Manitoba. For many years he directed *The Welcome Home* project for inner city residents in Winnipeg. Since January 2023, he was Provincial Superior for the combined English-Speaking, French-Speaking and Ukrainian Catholic Province for the Congregation of the Most

Holy Redeemer – the Redemptorists.

Following the transfer of Bishop Bryan Bayda from Saskatoon to the Eparchy of Toronto and Eastern Canada in 2022, the Eparchy of Saskatoon was administered by Metropolitan Archbishop Lawrence Huculak of Winnipeg.

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a <u>Statement on the Non-Permissibility</u> of Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide within Catholic Health Organizations with a Catholic Identity.

The Statement reads in part: "[We], the members of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, unanimously and unequivocally oppose the performance of either euthanasia or assisted suicide (MAiD) within health organizations with a Catholic identity. We oppose any efforts by governments or others to compel such facilities to perform MAiD in violation of Catholic teachings. Anything to the contrary would deeply betray the identity of these institutions as Catholic and would not be in keeping with the Church's moral teachings on the sanctity of life and the dignity of the human person."

New! The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops released a new document, entitled <u>Template</u> for Pastors on the Evangelization of Young People in Canada Today.

This document was developed by the Episcopal Commission for Doctrine and is intended as a resource for pastors and others in the Church who work in the evangelization of young people in the light of the Canadian context today.

The Office for Family and Life – Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has released its latest issue of <u>All Things News</u> (Quarterly Publication • Fifth Edition • Fall 2023). This issue includes a welcome message, reflection, tools for parishes and families, and other helpful resources.
