




From Fr. Bo:


Parishioners: Please be excited that you have an experienced and learned priest who will do his best to guide you forward.

Apostle Silas of the Seventy

The Holy Apostle of the Seventy Silas was a disciple of the Savior.

Saint Silas was a respected figure in the original Church at Jerusalem, one of the "chief men among the brethren" (Acts 15:22). The Council of the Apostles was convened at Jerusalem in the year 51 to deal with the question of whether Gentile Christian converts should be required to observe the Mosaic Law. The Apostles sent a message with Paul and Barnabas to the Christians of Antioch, giving the decision of the Council that Christians of Gentile origin did not have to observe the prescriptions of the Mosaic Law. Nonetheless, they were told that they must refrain from partaking of foods offered to idols, from things strangled and from blood, to refrain from fornication (Acts 15:20-29). Together with Saints Paul and Barnabas, the Council of the Apostles sent Saints Silas and Jude to explain the message in greater detail, since they both were filled with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Saint Jude was later sent back to Jerusalem, but Saint Silas remained at Antioch and zealously assisted Saint Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, on his missionary journeys preaching the Gospel. They visited Syria, Cilicia, and Macedonia.

In the city of Philippi they were accused of inciting unrest among the people, and for this they were arrested, beaten with rods, and then thrown into prison. At midnight, when the saints were at prayer, suddenly there was a strong earthquake, their chains fell off from them and the doors of the prison opened. The prison guard, supposing that the prisoners had fled, wanted to kill himself, but was stopped by the Apostle Paul. Then, he fell down trembling at the feet of the saints, and with faith accepted their preaching about Christ. He then led them out of the prison and took them to his own home, where he washed their wounds, and was baptized together with all his household.


From Philippi Saints Paul and Silas proceeded on to the cities of Amphipolis, Apollonia and Thessalonica. In each city they made new converts to Christ and built up the Church.

At Corinth the holy Apostle Silas was consecrated as bishop, and worked many miracles and signs, and there he finished his life.

Apostle Silvanus of the Seventy

The Holy Apostle of the Seventy Silvanus was a disciple of the Savior.

The Holy Apostle Silvanus preached the Word of God together with the chief Apostles Peter and Paul. In his First Epistle, the holy Apostle Peter makes mention of him: "By Silvanus, a faithful brother to you, as I suppose, I have written briefly..." (1 Peter 5:12). Saint Silvanus was made bishop at Thessalonica and died there a martyr, having undergone many sorrows and misfortunes for the Lord's sake.



The "Ostopowich" Tabernacle

When I first arrived at Dormition Parish about 5 years ago there was a large tabernacle in the storage room. This tabernacle was made in the old style that is most notably remembered for as "big". In fact I think a small child could fit inside the structure.

I asked about it and found out that this tabernacle was donated to the parish by the Ostopowich family in memory of their father (husband) Steve. It was used for several years.

When Fr. Myron came to Dormition parish, one project that he worked on was creating a more usable liturgical space. The Altar area was dominated by the large Holy Table with this large Tabernacle upon it. Due to the size of these things the priest had difficulty swinging the kadylo (incense), and there was little room for co-celebrants. In order to remedy this Fr. Myron had a new Holy Table built which was of a more suitable size.

With the changing of the Holy Table, the large Tabernacle needed also to be changed. So, a smaller one was borrowed from St. Nicholas Parish (so I'm told) and is in use till yesterday.

Being a creative guy, I spoke with some of the Ostopowich family who felt sad about their family's donation not being used, and I said that I could work on rebuilding it, using some of the original parts to create a smaller, usable tabernacle.

Over the past few years, I tried several times to come up with a plan, and then successfully recreated what you see in the pictures to the right. However, before I brought the tabernacle to the church, I had acquired a new tool that would change this project completely: a CNC router.

With this new tool, I new I could do a much fancier job, creating not just something smaller, but also significantly nicer. So I began taking the newly rebuilt structure apart again.

Sadly after I had taken the tabernacle apart, I discovered that my new (used, but new to me) tool did not work as good as it should. It took me over 2 years of fixing it to get it to the state it is in today.

Now, after doing some projects such as the processional Cross in memory of + Laurence Sirman, and the processional fans (ripidia) that stand next to it, I have created a carved door and walls. This past several weeks I have been working on it. Honestly it has it's imperfections, but it is coming together, literally.

Today you will see the practically "finished" tabernacle on the Holy Table. I still will need to do some more finishing touches like putting little Seraphim in the windows. But hopefully this re-building / restoration can bring some fond history back into the parish. This new version of the tabernacle is now in memory of both + Steve & + Zonia Ostopowich.

According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ. Gospel: Matthew 14:22-34; (NRSV)

At that time Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret.
