### Epistle – Galatians 2:16-20

A reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians.

Brethren (brothers and sisters), we know that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no flesh be justified.¹ But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners², is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not!³ But if I build up again those things which I tore down⁴, then I prove myself a transgressor.⁵ For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God.⁶ I have been crucified with

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> What does it mean to be justified? Faith in Jesus Christ is grammatically parallel to the works of the law and should be translated "the faith of Jesus Christ." The faith of Christ is the gospel. As the source of works is the law, so the source of faith is Christ. It is the faith of Christ—His beliefs, His trust, His obedience—that justifies us, not our faith as such. Christ's faith is seen in His entire life on earth, not in just a few of His crucial works.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Found to be sinners: i.e., living like Gentiles, who do not follow the Mosaic Law.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Justification is not merely legal but actual — effected by our real, personal union with Christ in His glorified human nature. That we could be found sinners shows this union never takes away our free will and explains how some defected to Judaism.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> Which I tore down: The Torah stood as a protective barrier between Israel and the idolatry of the Gentiles (Lev

<sup>15:31; 20:26).</sup> This dividing wall of separation has now been dismantled by Christ (Eph 2:14), who bring Jews and Gentiles together in the New Covenant (3:28).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> "things that I once tore down" are "the works of the law" (v. 16). Paul destroyed them in the sense of proving their ineffectiveness for salvation. The real transgressor here is one who tries to reinstitute the Jewish Law.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>6</sup> We die **through the law**, not bypassing or dishonoring it, but by recognizing that it is holy; that we deserve its consequence, death; and that we voluntarily die **to the law** through our death with Christ. Being crucified with Christ through baptism, we come alive to the law of the Spirit, which perfects the intention of the OT law. There is no contradiction between law and gospel. The law is "holy and just and good" (Rom 7:12). However, the law is "weak" (Rom 8:3) and "obsolete" (Heb 8:13), for it is fulfilled in the gospel, in Christ Himself.

Christ<sup>7</sup>; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me<sup>8</sup>; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me<sup>9</sup> and gave Himself for me.

#### Апостол – Галатів 2,16-20

*чтець:* До Галатів послання святого апостола Павла читання.

Браття і сестри! Довідавшися, що людина оправдується не ділами закону, але вірою в Ісуса Христа, ми увірували в Христа Ісуса, щоб виправдатися нам вірою в Христа, а не ділами закону, бо ділами закону не виправдається ніхто. Коли, отже, шукаючи виправдання в Христі, виявилось, що й ми самі грішники, невже тоді Христос служитель гріха? Не бути цьому! Бо коли я знову відбудовую те, що був зруйнував, я сам себе визнаю переступником. Я бо через закон для закону вмер, щоб жити для Бога: я з Христом розп'ятий. Живу вже не я, а живе в мені Христос. <sup>7</sup> Crucified with Christ: United with the Cross, Paul has died to an old order of things, namely, the slavery of sin and the regime of the Old Covenant. He describes this elsewhere as a sacramental union with Jesus effected through Baptism (Rom 6:3-8). I have been crucified with Christ means our sinful "passions and desires" (5:24) have been crucified. This is not the crucifixion of human nature, but of the flesh, the corruption into which human nature has fallen. This crucifixion must be willingly and freely accepted, just as Christ freely accepted His death. Living in the flesh (Gr. en sarki) is contrasted with living "in the faith" (Gr. en pistei), translated here by faith. Just as living in the flesh involves the whole person, body and soul, so living "in the faith" involves the whole person. Justification therefore constitutes substantial union with Christ, not just an abstract position of the believer with respect to God.

<sup>8</sup> **lives in me:** Believers possess life that is natural and biological (human life) as well as supernatural and theological (divine life). While it is no longer I who live under the dominion of sinful passions and desires, I do live a crucified life in Christ. As we are not saved by works alone, nowhere does the NT say we are saved by faith alone. We are saved by faith, but not faith *alone*.

# Gospel – Mark 8:34-9:1

At that time, Jesus called to Him the multitude with His disciples, and said to them, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross<sup>10</sup> and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. For what will it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? For what can a man give in return for their life?<sup>11</sup> For whoever is ashamed of Me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed, when He comes<sup>12</sup> in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Truly I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>9</sup> **who lived me:** Jesus endured the torture and shame of the Cross for the entire world collectively and for every person – individually.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>10</sup> take up your cross: a graphic image of suffering. It refers to the Roman custom of forcing criminals to carry on their shoulders a crossbar to the site of their crucifixion. Jesus wars that disciples must be so committed to Him that they are willing to endure persecution, hardship, and even death. The faithful, He assures them, will find resurrection and glory beyond the hardships of this life. The cross is also a symbol of suffering by Christians in imitation of Christ. We practice self-denial for the sake of the love of God and the gospel. Accepting this suffering is not a punishment, nor is it an end in itself, but a means to overcome the fallen world for the sake of the Kingdom and to crucify the flesh with its passions and desires (Gal 5:24).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> This question emphasizes the utter foolishness of accumulating worldly wealth or power, for none of this can redeem man's fallen soul, nor benefit a person in the life to come.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>12</sup> **When He comes:** The Father has given Christ the authority to judge the living and the dead. At the appointed time He will reward the righteous with eternal life and punish those who are ashamed of him with eternal fire.

# The Elevation of the Precious and Life-Creating Cross

The pagan Roman emperors tried to completely eradicate from human memory the holy places where our Lord Jesus Christ suffered and was resurrected for mankind. The Emperor Hadrian (117-138) gave orders to cover over the ground of Golgotha and the Sepulchre of the Lord, and to build a temple of the pagan goddess Venus and a statue of Jupiter.

Pagans gathered at this place and offered sacrifice to idols there. Eventually after 300 years, by Divine Providence, the great Christian sacred remains, the Sepulchre of the Lord and the Life-Creating Cross were again discovered and opened for veneration. This took place under the Emperor Constantine the Great (306-337), after his victory in the year 312 over Maxentius, ruler of the Western part of the Roman empire, and over Licinius, ruler of its Eastern part. In the year 323 Constantine became the sole ruler of the vast Roman Empire.

In 313 he had issued the Edict of Milan, by which the Christian religion was legalized and the persecutions against Christians in the Western half of the empire were stopped. The ruler Licinius, although he had signed the Edict of Milan to oblige Constantine, still fanatically continued the persecutions against Christians. Only after his conclusive defeat did the 313 Edict of toleration extend also to the Eastern part of the empire. Emperor Constantine, having gained victory over his enemies in three wars with God's assistance,

had seen in the heavens the Sign of the Cross, and written beneath: "By this you shall conquer."

Ardently desiring to find the Cross on which our Lord Jesus Christ was crucified, Constantine sent his mother, the pious Empress Helen (May 21), to Jerusalem, providing her with a letter to St Macarius, Patriarch of Jerusalem.

Although the holy empress Helen was already in her declining years, she set about completing the task with enthusiasm. The empress gave orders to destroy the pagan temple and the statues in Jerusalem. Searching for the Sepulchre (Tomb) of the Lord she made inquiry of Christians and Jews. She was directed to a certain elderly Hebrew by the name of Jude who stated that the Sepulchre was buried where the temple of Venus stood. They demolished the pagan temple and, after praying, they began to excavate the ground. Soon the Tomb of the Lord was uncovered. Not far from it were three crosses, a board with the inscription ordered by Pilate, and four nails which had pierced the Lord's Body (March 6).





In order to discern on which of the three crosses the Savior was crucified, Patriarch Macarius alternately touched the crosses to a corpse. When the Cross of the Lord touched the dead one, he came to life. Having beheld the raising of the dead man, everyone was convinced that the Life-Creating Cross was found.

Christians came in a huge throng to venerate the Tomb of the Lord and the Holy Cross, beseeching St Macarius to elevate the Cross, so that even those far off might reverently contemplate it. Then the Patriarch and other spiritual leaders raised up the Holy Cross, and the people, saying "Lord have mercy," reverently prostrated before the Venerable Wood. This solemn event occurred in the year 326.

During the discovery of the Life-Creating Cross another miracle took place: a grievously sick woman, beneath the shadow of the Holy Cross, was

healed instantly. The elder Jude and other Jews there believed in Christ and accepted Holy Baptism. Jude received the name Cyriacus and afterwards consecrated Bishop of Jerusalem. During the reign of Julian the Apostate (361-363) he accepted a martyr's death for Christ.


The holy empress Helen journeyed to the holy places connected with the earthly life of the Savior, **building** 



more than 80 churches. Four of the largest churches were built: at Bethlehem the birthplace of Christ; on the Mount of Olives where the Lord ascended to Heaven; at Gethsemane where the Savior prayed before His sufferings; and also at Gethsemane, at the place where the Mother of God was buried and from where she was assumed into heaven body and soul.

St. Helen took part of the Life-Creating Wood and nails with her to Constantinople. The holy emperor Constantine gave orders to build at Jerusalem a majestic and spacious church in honor of the Resurrection of Christ, also including under its roof the Life-Giving Tomb of the Lord and Golgotha. The temple was constructed in about ten years. St Helen did not survive until the dedication of the temple, she died in the year 327. The church was consecrated on September 13, 335. On the following day, September 14, the festal celebration of the Exaltation of the Venerable and Life-Creating Cross was established.

Another event connected to the Cross of the Lord is remembered also on this day is its return to



Jerusalem from Persia after fourteen years of captivity. During the reign of the Byzantine emperor Phocas (602-610) the Persian emperor Khozroes II in a war against the Christian Roman Empire defeated the Roman army, plundered Jerusalem and captured both the Life-Creating Cross of the Lord and the Holy Patriarch Zachariah (609-633).

The Cross remained in Persia for fourteen years and only under the emperor Heraclius (610-641), who with the help of God defeated Khozroes and concluded peace with his successor and son Syroes, was the Cross of the Lord returned to the Christians.

With great solemnity the Life-creating Cross was transferred to Jerusalem. Emperor Heraclius in imperial crown and royal purple carried the Cross of Christ into the temple of the Resurrection. With the emperor went Patriarch Zacharios. At the gates by which they ascended Golgotha, the emperor suddenly stopped and was not able to proceed farther. The holy Patriarch explained to the emperor that an angel of the Lord was blocking his way. The emperor was told to remove his royal trappings and to walk barefoot, since He Who bore the Cross for the salvation of the world from sin had made His way to Golgotha in all humility. Then Heraclius donned plain garb, and without further hindrance, carried the Cross of Christ into the church

# A press conference was held on the results of the Synod of the UGCC

On September 14, at the end of the work of the Synod of Bishops of the UGCC, which took place in Rome from September 3 to 13, 2023, a press conference was held at the premises of the Ukrainian Pontifical College. His Beatitude Sviatoslav, Head and Father of the UGCC, and Archbishop Borys Gudziak, Metropolitan of the Philadelphia Metropolis of the UGCC, spoke with representatives of the international media accredited to the Holy See.



His Beatitude Sviatoslav told the media about the 10 working days of the Synod of Bishops in Rome, in particular about the main pastoral task of the Church - "healing wounds in wartime." "As a Church, we understand that the survival of our people depends not only on military or political support, but also on our ability to survive the trauma of war. Each of us is traumatized by the war: bishops, priests, monks, so we must also learn to accompany people in our pastoral ministry in a new way."

Commenting on the meeting of the bishops of the UGCC with the Holy Father Francis, His Beatitude Sviatoslav stressed: "We have experienced an important meeting with Pope Francis. Two hours of fraternal, open, sincere

and genuine dialogue. His Holiness moved the meeting with us forward an hour precisely to give our bishops the opportunity to speak out and bear witness to what they are experiencing."

The Head of the UGCC said: "The Pope listened to us carefully and said: 'Perhaps you doubt who the Pope is with, and this causes another pain to Ukrainians, but I want to assure you that I am with you.' Now our task is to convey these words of the Pope to our faithful."

In the context of the conversation about the role of the Holy See in the release of

prisoners, special attention was paid to the release of two Redemptorist priests arrested by the occupation authorities in Berdyansk. His Beatitude Sviatoslav stressed: "We are looking for all possible channels to at least learn about their fate. We have appealed to many international organizations to help speed up the process of their release."

His Beatitude Sviatoslav also pointed out the significance of the mission of Cardinal Zuppi, who recently paid a visit to Beijing. "China is one of the main geopolitical players that has always declared its readiness to cooperate for the sake of peace," said the Head of the UGCC. "Cardinal Zuppi is currently in China after visits to Kyiv, Moscow and Washington. For us, this is a clear sign that the Pope has not come to terms with the war. The Holy See and the Holy Father are not indifferent to what is happening in our country and are looking for every opportunity to put an end to this senseless and God-killing war."

"This mission opens certain channels. Everything that we handed over to the cardinal in Kyiv, he took to Moscow: the issue of the return of deported children and a list of many Ukrainian civilians abducted and missing as a result of Russian aggression."





Archbishop Borys Gudziak showed journalists a photo of students of the Pontifical College in 2015-2016, including Oleh Tsuniovsky, who was at the front and lost an arm and a leg as a result of injury. "Such boys and girls are paying a high price today for what we call European values," Metropolitan Borys stressed. He also pointed to the fact that almost 30 years ago Ukraine gave up nuclear weapons, "making not only a political, but also a gospel gesture." "After the collapse of the Soviet Union, our country had the third largest nuclear potential. Ukraine has never prepared for war and, due to the voluntary loss of its nuclear status, has demonstrated to the whole world its intentions to build peace in relations of international coexistence," Bishop Borys emphasized and called on the world community to remember this fact when it comes to security guarantees for Ukraine.
